All Science departments are equipped with LCD projectors and various sophisticated instruments for experiments and other laboratory uses. Besides, a sophisticated digital classroom has been constructed with financial assistance from the Government of Assam. The campus of the college is Wi-Fi enabled and under strict CC TV surveillance.

Strict vigilance is maintained for the regularity of the scheduled classes. Apart from normal teaching learning routine of the college, the students are continuously motivated to take part in a series of extracurricular activities in and around the campus.
