
Report of Student Satisfaction Survey on Teaching Learning Process 2018-19


1. How much of the syllabus was covered in the class?






4. The teacher's approach to teaching can best be described as































Feedback on Syllabus by Students



1. Syllabus is too bulky




2. Satisfied with the distribution of content across papers






Students Feedback on College Environment

1. Principal's relation with Students


61% of the respondent stated that Principal's relation with the students is very good. 38% of them stated as good and 1% of the respondent stated as poor.

57% of the respondent student mentioned that cooperation of the college office with students is very good.


30% of the respondent mentioned that cooperation of the office with students is good. 13% of the respondents stated it as poor.


(a) Library

(b) College canteen



39% of the respondent stated that the facilities provided by the college for drinking water is very good.


42% of them stated that drinking water facilities in the college is good and 19% of the respondent stated as poor

20% of the surveyed students stated that the Girls'/ Boys' Common Room of the college is very good.



(e) Sports facilities for Students


21% of the respondent student mentioned that sports facilities of the college are very good.

(f) Parking place for Students



34% of the respondent student mentioned that condition of classrooms of the college is very good.



(h) Condition of Auditorium


26% of the respondent student mentioned that sports facilities of the college are very good.

39% of the respondent stated that power supply of the college is very good. 58% of them stated as good and 3% of the respondent stated as poor
















Incorporation of relevant materials in (%)


Intellectually stimulating in (%)




Interdisciplinary orientation in (%)


Emphasis on practice in (%)


Orientated towards value education in (%)


1. How far the service rendered by the Nalbari College alumnus has satisfied you as the employer?

0% Employers stated the service rendered by the alumnus of Nalbari College is average.




2. Rate the required relevant professional skills of the Nalbari College alumnus by employee.








