DEPARTMENT OF ASSAMESE:

Field visit to Bardowa (2019):

Field study is an important aspect of formal education as it contributes towards the mental and intellectual development of students. Keeping this point in view, the students of Post Graduate classes of Assamese Department, Nalbari College, were taken to the Vaishnavite monastery of Bardowa on 28/02/2019. Bardowa or Batadraba is a sacred pilgrimage of Assam. The great Assamese Vaishnavite guru Srimanta Sankardev established the monastery here in 1468. Situated at a distance of eighteen kilometers from Nagaon town, this monastery or *satra* holds special significance as it is associated with Srimanta Sankardev's childhood, youth and vocation. The monastery is surrounded by the sprawling campus of 286 bighas of land, and this is the place from where the Vishnavite leader started spreading the *ek saran naam dharma*, that is, the cult which pledges devotion to Lord Vishnu alone.




A field visit to Akashiganga and Maha Mrittyunjay Mandir (2021):

Akashiganga is a waterfall located about 50k.m south-east of Doboka-Dimapur road of Nagaon district. Several archaeological remains can be found in this place. According to the ancient myth Goddess Sati immolated herself in the sacred fire that was prepared for the Yagyas of her father who had shown disrespect to Mahadev. The grief stricken Mahadev had carried the burnt body of Sati and was on the verge of destroying the universe by dancing the Tandav. Lord Vishnu intervened and dismembered Sati's dead body with his Chakra into 108 pieces. One piece is believed to have fallen near in Akashiganga. Therefore, devotees take a dip in the water to be blessed by the Goddess. Some remains of stone temple are seen near the waterfall.Mahamrittyunjay is another temple located in Nagaon district. This temple is special in its architectural sense as it is built in for, a shivlinga in the month of February 2021 and its height is 126 feet. Visit to both these historical places provide lots of pleasure and knowledge.









Field visit to Dirgheswari Mandir & Doulgobinda Mandir (2022):

The trip to Dirgheswari temple took place on 08/01/2022. This temple is situated on Sitachal hill, near Rangmahal, North Guwahati. This temple was built by the Ahom king Siva Singha and it is one of the prime places of worship of the *Shakti* cult. This devalaya or temple is known for its annual Durga Puja. There is an idol of the goddess Durga in the sanctum sanctorum, which is housed in a small underground cave. Many stone statues have been excavated from temple premises of Dirgheswari.

Field visit to SriSurjya Pahar (2023):

Sri Surjya Pahar is located about 12 k.m of south-east of Goalpara district of Assam. This archaeological site is surrounded by numerous rock cut idols and a long hill with Shivalingas. Apart from Hindu Shivalingas it has been observed here the idols of Buddhist stupas and Jain Tirthankaras. According to ancient legend, people have found 99999 Shivalingas were engraved here by Vyasha in order to build up a second Kashi. Till now no scientific calculation has been done on various sizes of Shivalingas available here. For which no one knows how many of them are still in intact status. It is expected that a detailed research on about this subject will explore various political and religious aspects of Assam.







The students of Mathematics department visited the Industrial Estate Nalbari on 11/03/2023 as a part of experiential learning.





• Report:

Assam is known for its traditional handicrafts such bell metal handicraft bamboo handicraft, weaving, jute handicraft, pottery handicraft etc.Out of these handicrafts bamboo and weaving handicraft engage large section of both male and female artisans. The traditional bamboo craft industry besides providing employment and livelihood to the rural artisan, also provide large scope for export.Nalbari district is considered hub of bamboo craft especially in the production of *Japi*and other bamboo products. Mugkuchi village in The Pub-Nalbari block isthe study area of the field visit. The Japi craft is basically based on family labour but during peak period that is during *Bihu*and other festivity hired labour become essential. In the study area, majority of the households (89%) were dependent on the craftsas the primary source of their income, whereas only 11% were engaged in agriculture and allied activities.

Difficulties faced by the rural artisans:

Some of the problems highlighted by the artisans are -

- ✓ Shortage of raw materials and capital
- ✓ Reduced demand in the market
- ✓ Durability issues
- ✓ There is also lack of awareness among artisans regarding various government schemes through which the artisans can be benefited.

Conclusion:


The field visit highlighted the fact that target bared specific policy in the need of the hour


A field visit was organised by the department of Economics, Nalbari College, in Mugkuchi village of the district. A team of 18 students of Economics Honours along with two teacher, Dr. Aditi Das and Rintu Deka of the Department carried out the field visit.

The field trip highlighted the following points:

There are around 16 brass metal industries in the district which is categorised under small scale industries providing job opportunities to the rural youth particularly those skilled in the art of bell metal products. The industry is basically labour intensive industry and is operated mainly by the family members.

While conducting the field visit the students got the opportunity to meet Arup Haloi , the owner of "Bhagyashree PitalUdog" (Reg: 02/17/00101/PNT/SSI). While discussion with the owner, it was found that along with the North Eastern states, most of the brass metal products are exported to Delhi. The peak seasons of the products are mainly during the wedding season and after the month of September. During the months of July and August, the demands for the products are at the low. Since Bell Metal industry is a familyoriented industry the net profit is high. Students visited few industries of the Mugkuchi area and had the opportunity to look at the technique of manufacturing various products and were overwhelmed by the artistic skill of the workers.
