Profile of the Nalbari College

Brief Introduction of the College

Nalbari College is in Nalbari, Assam, India. The college is affiliated to Gauhati University and recognized by University Grants Commission (UGC). Since its inception, the institution imparts higher education to the economically backward people of this locality, especially those belonging to Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes communities.

Nalbari College is one of the premier colleges of Assam. Established way back in pre-independent era (4th July 1945), this college has taken a pioneering role in shaping and promoting higher education in the entire lower Brahmaputra valley. In the beginning, the college was affiliated to the Calcutta University, but in 1948, when Gauhati University was established, it came under the academic jurisdiction of the latter. The college received the UGC recognition under Section 2(f) in 1962. Beginning with a modest number of only 28 students, today it has a sizable strength of about 4420 students (including Higher Secondary programme). Spreading over 16 acres of land, the college has a built up area of approximately 8 acres.

Nalbari College is a multi-streamed co-educational institution imparting education right from Higher Secondary to PG level. At present it offers UG programmes for 09 Humanities & Social Science departments and 07 Science departments and PG programme for Assamese and English. Being aware of the issue of employability of its pass outs, the college offered two UGC sponsored job-oriented programmes like Travel and Tourism Guidance and Disaster Management. Further, since 2013, the College with approval from the Gauhati University has introduced two more professional courses i.e. Bachelor of Physical Education (B.P.E.) and Bachelor of Science in Information Technology (B.Sc. IT) on regular basis. Nalbari College is probably the first college to start B.P.E in entire Assam. From the last session the college has started two new self financing courses i.e. Bachelor of Computer Application (BCA) and Post Graduate Diploma in Computer Application (PGDCA) and from the current session the college has decided to introduce PG programme for English.

In order to facilitate those students who cannot pursue regular education, the college offers distance learning mode through its affiliating centres of Gauhati University Centre for Distance and Online Education (GUCDOE), Krishna Kanta Handique State Open University (KKHSOU) and Assam State Open School (ASOS). The issue of employability is in the prime agenda of the college. Therefore, in coming years the college is prospecting to introduce more and more such programmes which would provide employment opportunity to the students.

The inputs received from the departments as per the proforma (Annexure-1) have been validated from the supporting documents, interaction with the Head of the Department, and visits to the departments.

• Curricular Aspects

Nalbari College, Nalbari is affiliated with Gauhati University. The College follows the curriculum developed by Gauhati University. effective delivery of curriculum, the departments maintaining lessonplans and course progress records. Departments follow the academic calendar of Gauhati University and the college has its own in alignment with Gauhati University's calendar.

Teaching learning aspects

Assessment of learning levels to identify slow and advanced learners is carried out through sessional examination, seminars, and assignments. Though the College follows students' centric learning method for effective curriculum delivery, however, a detailed unit-wise plan for experiential and participative learning needs to be maintained for enhancing the learning experiences of the students. The College maintains a mentoring system. All the conduct internal examinations departments per the of the affiliating University. The College different modes for continuous incorporate internal more evaluation.

Program Outcomes, Program Specific Outcomes, and Course Outcomes are described in the syllabus. Evaluation of the attainment of the learning outcomes to be evaluated properly.

• Research, Innovation, and Extension

The college has recently started various research activities. However, the overall research culture in the College needs to be strengthened. Several departments are conducting very effective extension activities. The involvement of the students in those activities should be encouraged.

• Infrastructure

The College has adequate infrastructure facilities for all academic and other extracurricular activities. The indoor and outdoor play area is adequate. The library and IT facilities need to be improved including increased internet bandwidth.

Student Support and Progression

Several departments conduct capacity-building and skill enhancement activities for the students. The placement of the students and progression to higher education is encouraging. Students need more encouragement for participation in extracurricular activities.

• Professional DevelopmentActivities

A few teachers have participated in FDP. But more teachers need to be participated in FDPs.

- Lack of Govt. provisions for substitute faculties against lien, maternity leave and child care leave.
- Limited scope for research oriented activities

➤ Lack of skilled non-teaching staff

Opportunities

- ➤ Scope for introducing new courses and programmes
- ➤ High quality student intake with brilliant academic result
- ➤ Nalbari being a major hub of various forms of performing and folk art forms like Oja Pali, Dhulia, Nagara Naam, Puppet theatre etc., the college is poised to act as a nodal institution for conducting research in these unexplored art forms.
- ➤ Bamboo Arts/crafts centre

Challenges

- ➤ Contemporary apathy towards general education
- ➤ Mushrooming of private institutions
- ➤ Lack of coordination between administrative and academic authority i.e. the state government and the university respectively
- > Lackadaisical policy of examination and evaluation followed by the parent university.
- ➤ Uneven Teacher- Student ratio
- ➤ Inadequate government funding

Recommendations

- Outcome Based Education to be implemented for calculation of attainment level of the students.
- Students may be provided more experiential learning.
- The college needs to evolve a structured methodology for identifying the slow learners and remedial measures for their improvement based on outcome based education (OBE).
- Few large classrooms need to be created with ICT facilities to conduct common classes to conduct the common coursesfor FYUGP.
- The college may arrange a motivational lecture/counseling for the entire fresher at the beginning of the session.
- The teachers may be encouraged to enhance their research output, fund mobilization, consultancy services. To that end, the Principal may arrange brainstorming sessions time to time among the teachers to listen to their views and prepare a strategy for increasing research output of the teachers.
- Adequate ICT enabled class room facility may be made available to the academic departments.
- For effective delivery of curriculum, the course file of Academic departments should be assessed by IQAC.
- Research culture needs much improvement and multidisciplinary research to be initiated.
- More departments and students should be involved in the extension activities.
- More teachers should be participated in the FIP/FDP programmes.
- Proper documentation is required for all activities.

- Best practices of individual departments should be identified and need to be institutionalized.
- Students and society need to be engaged while formulating policies specific to students' welfare and society.
- More collaboration needs to be established for faculty exchange, students exchange, internship etc.
- RFID based digitalization of the central library of the college
- Master list of all the office related documents with document number and retention time, SOPs and vendors feedback need to maintain.
- Safety issues like fire extinguishers to be placed in some selected areas;
 distinct markings for emergency exits should be there in the multi-storied buildings.
